Parish Update on Reopening - June 8, 2020

Dear Members and Friends of Saint George in Schenectady,

In God's abundant mercy we live in hope and of course, in obedience. Let us sing His praises joyfully as we reopen. With the guidance of the state and the Archdiocese, we have been given guidelines to safely reopen our churches. The situation has been difficult to track and thus plan for, however, we are confident that with our adherence to these measures, and of course with everyone's cooperation and understanding, we can provide a safe space to worship in. Glory to the Almighty.

No more sign-ups needed. Admittance will be on a first come first serve basis. Once capacity in the main church is reached (25% occupancy is allowed), individuals will be given the option to worship in the Hellenic center where there will be special "distance seating" and the Divine Liturgy will play on our big projector and screen and speakers. All the faithful will be able to receive Holy Communion, Antidoron (blessed bread - in prepackaged zip-lock bags), and of course light candles and votives in the church, as always.



If you have any questions, feel free to contact Brian Goodale our Parish Council President, or Fr. Neofitos directly.

Many officers, ushers, and church staff have worked and continue to work diligently to keep our facility clean, orderly, and safe.

Upon arrival, the ushers will collect all attendees' name, email, and phone number, along with taking everyone's temperature. All **MUST** listen to the direction of the ushers and Fr. Neofitos at all times in the church, in order to keep everyone as safe as possible.

We ask that everyone please wear a face mask, practice social distancing, and plan to exit the church immediately after liturgy. We must remind everyone that if you are or have been ill or in contact with anyone ill recently, we recommend you remain home for worship.

Unfortunately, for now, there will be no coffee hour or fellowship during our incremental reopening.

We look forward to once again being in each other's company in worship and prayer. Once there is a plan in place for safe fellowship, rest assured, we will work hard to allow for the beautiful souls of St. George to relax and "break bread" at coffee hour. Our God has given us everything and He will continue to provide for us. We are grateful to all those who have shown us support during this difficult time. Your fortitude and patience during this difficult time has been inspiring.

Brethren, all the saints through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated - of whom the world was not worthy - wandering over deserts and mountains and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfection of our faith.


Bible Study/Book Club News

Although our services continue to be live streamed for those unable to attend services, the faithful are now able to worship at the Divine Liturgy in person at 25% capacity according to CDC and Archdiocesan guidelines. Thanks to the meticulous planning by Father Neofitos and the parish council, these guidelines were successfully implemented. Since Sunday, May 31st we have been able to receive Holy Communion. With much anticipation and reverence, Fellowship members were the first to come forward to receive the Holy Gifts.

Sadly, Fellowship members are mourning the loss of our former member and good friend Angela Theodore. She passed from this life on May 9, 2020 after a lengthy illness. May her memory be eternal. Angela's beloved sister, Ifigenia T. Brown, survives. We are happy to report that although Fellowship member Dom Dicocco and our co-President Paul Pagiotas were both briefly hospitalized last month, they are now happily at home and recuperating. We wish them both well as we keep them in our prayers. May God grant them and all of us continued good health.

Finally, we continue our fervent prayer that the pandemic will soon be overcome so that we can safely congregate together again in our beloved church of St. George.

Stewardship

Why is church important to me? Why is stewardship important to me? Eliana Georgelos

As long as I can remember, I have needed to have my church close to me. I've been blessed that St. George has always been a part of my life. As a child, I vividly recall attending Divine Liturgies, Holy Day services, Sunday school and Greek school. I've been singing in the choir since I was in my early teens. My husband Greg and I were married at St. George, we baptized our children here, and we were always active within the community, whether through the Parish Council, Sunday School, Philoptochos or the Fellowship group. Following Greg's passing, the St George community surrounded me with love and support, giving me the strength to heal. Throughout my life, the church of St. George has always been there for me and effected every facet of my being. It continues to do so today, and I cannot imagine my life without it.

Where would we be without our beloved St. George? For a while this past year, we weren't sure how long our church would exist. We had no priest, yet for almost a year we kept our church open by encouraging our parishioners to come for silent prayer and the lighting of candles. Gladys chanted the Orthros and occasionally gave talks about various saints. Afterwards we offered fellowship through a coffee hour for those who came to church. In this way, we kept the spirit of our patron Saint George alive.

Today we are blessed to have Father Neofitos and Presvytera Catherine as the spiritual leaders of our church. God heard our prayers and answered them with Father's Ordination to the priesthood and assignment to our community. This young couple has brought joy and a sense of hope to us with their love, encouragement and positive attitudes.

The difficult issue we are faced with, however, is how to keep our church going when so few of us are giving our time, talents and treasures to the church. We cannot continue to keep our doors open with so little financial support. Our budget shows that our main source of income is not through stewardship as it should be, but through our annual Greek festival. Every year, it becomes more and more difficult to put this on. The majority of us are aging and losing our strength, energy and ability to work so many hours in putting on a festival which doesn't even cover all our expenses. Our church building as well as our Hellenic Center are in need of extensive and expensive repairs. We have a wonderful new priest whose salary depends on our financial stability. Father Neofitos is in the process of initiating new ministries into our church, such as our bible study/book club and our youth groups among others. As stewards of our church, we should be supporting these ministries as they are being initiated. We should be giving wholeheartedly to our church as a way of thanking God for the gifts that He has bestowed upon us. If we have received the gift of a comfortable income that meets our needs...let us thank God. If His gift to us is good health, a loving family, a roof over our heads...let us thank God. If we truly are good stewards, we should put aside part of our income to give to the church as a way of thanking God for what He has granted to us. It's as simple as that. And God rewards the faithful giver!

If more of us accept the responsibility that God has given us to be good stewards and to support the ministries of our church, St. George will thrive rather than cease to exist. I hope and pray with all my heart that however many years are remaining to me, I will live them within the loving community of my beloved Church of Saint George.
