πτωχῶν υπερασπιστῆς, ασθενοῦντων ἰατρός,
βασιλέων υπέρμαχος, τροπαιοφόρε
μεγαλομάρτυς Γεώργιε, πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ
Θεῷ θῆναι τάς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν.

Κοντάκιον

Ἐπὶ τοῦ ὄρους μετεμορφώθης, καὶ ὡς
ἐχώρουν οἱ Μαθηταὶ σου τὴν δόξαν σου,
Χριστέ ὁ Θεὸς ἐθεάσαντο, ἵνα ὅταν σε
ἴδωσι σταυρούμενον, τὸ μὲν πάθος
νοήσωσιν ἐκούσιον, τῷ δὲ κόσμῳ
κηρύξωσιν, ὅτι σὺ ὑπάρχεις ἀληθῶς, τοῦ
Πατρὸς τὸ ἀπαύγασμα.

Resurrectional Apolytikion

The stone had been secured with a seal by the
Judeans, * and a guard of soldiers was watching
Your immaculate body. * You rose on the third
day, O Lord * and Savior, granting life unto the
world. * For this reason were the powers of
heaven crying out to You, O Life-giver: * Glory to
Your resurrection, O Christ; * glory to Your
kingdom; * glory to Your dispensation, only One
who loves mankind.

Apolytikion of the Feast

You were transfigured upon the mountain,
O Christ our God, showing to Your
disciples Your glory as much as they could
bear. Do also in us, sinners though we may
be, shine Your everlasting light, by the
intercessions of the Theotokos, O Giver of
light. Glory to You.

Troparion of St. George

Liberator of captives, defender of the
Poor, physician of the sick, and champion
Of kings, O trophy-bearer, Great Martyr George,
intercede with Christ God that our souls be
saved.

Kontakion

Upon the mountain were You transfigured,
and Your disciples beheld Your glory as far
as they were able, O Christ our God; so that
when they would see You crucified they might
understand that Your Passion was deliberate,
and declare to the world that in truth You are
the Father's radiance.



St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 4:9-16

Brethren, God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, like men sentenced to death; because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to men. We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honor, but we in disrepute. To the present hour we hunger and thirst, we are ill-clad and buffeted and homeless, and we labor, working with our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; when slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become, and are now, as the refuse of the world, the off-scouring of all things. I do not write this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel. I urge you, then, be imitators of me.



The Gospel according to Matthew 17:14-23

At that time, a man came up to Jesus and kneeling before him said, "Lord, have mercy on my son, for he is an epileptic and he suffers terribly; for often he falls into the fire, and often into the water. And I brought him to your disciples, and they could not heal him." And Jesus answered, "O faithless and perverse generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him here to me." And Jesus rebuked him, and the demon came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. Then the disciples came to Jesus privately and said, "Why could we not cast it out?" He said to them, "Because of your little faith. For truly I say to you, if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move hence to yonder place,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. But this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting." As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of man is to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day."

Children's Sundays

The first Sunday of every month, Fr. Sean will be presenting a Children's Sermon for all of our parish children. Please pass the news on and bring your kids, grandchildren, godchildren, nieces, and nephews and have them sit up in the first few pews, as Father will be speaking directly to them. The Liturgy on those days will be mostly in English to accommodate our young people so that they may understand the Liturgy better. This is a good way to get our kids involved and have them feel as though they are a major part of our community of faith.
