From the desk of Fr. Neofitos

House Blessings

It is a distinct blessing, each year during the season of Holy Theophany, for all Orthodox Christians to have their homes and places of business blessed by their priest. The yearly blessing of homes at the Feast of the Theophany touches our daily lives with the sanctifying water in which our Lord was baptized. In blessing a home, the Church asks God to drive away every evil influence from our home and those who live in it, and to renew with extra vigor the influence of the Holy Spirit in our homes and lives. The Fathers speak of the Christian home as a little church, and just as we chase away the influences of the evil one from our parish, so too must we do in our own family.

How to Prepare for a Home / Business Blessing

In preparing for a house blessing, the following should be noted:

1. A quiet and reverent environment: Turn off the television and radio before the priest arrives. Assemble all the family and friends in the home around the kitchen or wherever an icon is prepared for the occasion. When the priest arrives, turn off our phones.

2. Prepare the table: For the house blessing, the priest will require the following: An icon, a lit candle, a hand censer, a small, clean bowl for holy water, and a sprig of basil. (if possible)

Troparion of Theophany several times:

When Thou, O Lord, wast baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest!
For the voice of the Father bore witness to Thee, and called Thee His beloved Son!
And the Spirit, in the form of a dove, confirmed the truthfulness of His word.
O Christ our God, Who hast revealed Thyself and hast enlightened the world, glory to Thee!



Frequently Asked Questions

How do I become a member of the parish?

Membership in the Orthodox Church begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues throughout our life. We are united with Christ through the sacraments, or mysteries, of the Church and through our faithful offering of our entire selves to Jesus Christ. Our Archdiocese requires each panish to distinguish between voting members and non-voting members. A voting member is over 18 years of age and turns in a signed stewardship commitment card, committing a portion of time, talent and treasture to the Church. The Archdiocese also requires the voting member to remain current through the year on their commitments. Keep in mind that true membership in the Body of Christ involves living according to His word and within His Church. Why must I commit to give a specific amount? Please keep in mind that your stewardship of money is kept in the strictest of confidence. However, we do compile the amounts anticipated to better plan our budget.

What if I cannot fulfill my stewardship commitment?

During the course of a year, circumstances change. Your stewardship is valued because it is made out of your love for God and His Church. Please do not be concerned if you are unable to meet your stewardship commitment – we are glad you are a part of this parish.

MEMORIAL SERVICES and PHILOPTOCHOS COFFEE HOUR SPONSORSHIP

Please call the church office (518-393-0742) to schedule a Memorial Service. The Ladies Philoptochos Society oversees the coffee hour every Sunday. After reserving the date with the Parish Priest, you need to contact Lucy Brady, Coffee Hour Chairperson, at 518-542-4391 if you wish to sponsor a Memorial Coffee Hour. Memorial Coffee Hours are by special arrangement only and it is your responsibility to make this request. Upon confirmation, the following should be expected:

Food

The food provided for a memorial is a combination of baked good items, cookies, cheese & crackers, fruit, etc. A quart of milk for the coffee and half gallon of orange juice for the children is included. **The Ladies Philoptochos will purchase the food for you and present you with receipts for reimbursement.** Should you prefer to offer a Memorial Coffee Hour on your own, please include milk for coffee and juice in addition to whatever food items you choose.

Coffee/Tea/Paper Goods

A flat fee for coffee, tea, and paper goods is charged. If there are multiple memorial coffee hours the cost is to be shared equally by the sponsors.

The Ladies of the Philoptochos Society will do the grocery shopping, set up, and serve your coffee hour. In addition, a sign is prepared with the name of the sponsorship family and the person in whose memory the coffee hour is being held.

Philoptochos is honored to play a role in the celebration of the feast day of St. Basil on January 1st.

The legend of Saint Basil, The story goes that Saint Basil, a bishop known for his generosity, asked the citizens of Caesarea to contribute gold and jewelry to end a siege. The citizens were so generous that the enemy called off the siege without collecting the ransom. Saint Basil then baked the valuables into loaves of bread and distributed them to the people, and each citizen received exactly what they had given.





The tradition of Vasilopita. In honor of Saint Basil, people bake a sweet bread or cake with a hidden coin or trinket, called a flouri,

and cut it on New Year's Day. The person who receives the slice with the coin is said to be blessed with good luck for the new year. The cake is also a reminder of what Saint Basil did for the people of Greece.

Philoptochos will bring the Vasilopita breads for blessing and distribution in church on January 5th.

Together with Saint Gregory the Theologian and Saint John Chrysostom, Saint Basil the Great is recognized as one of the three great hierarchs of the Orthodox Church. The Church celebrates the feast of these venerable Three Hierarchs on January 30th.

Saint Basil's Academy, which provides shelter and nurtures children and families, bears the name of Saint Basil in his honor. Philoptochos will pass a special collection tray on January 5th for the benefit of the children served by St. Basil's Academy in Garrison, NY.
