From the desk of Fr. Neofitos

"Lord, Remember me when You come into Your Kingdom"



These were the words uttered by the penitent thief on Jesus' right side. We too pray the same words daily. Are our words just words, or are they more? When the thief said these blessed words, he gave himself to the Lord fully. This was a transformation. A true confession. A fervent plea for mercy and forgiveness.

This is not how this man's journey began. In the gospel of Matthew it says: Even the robbers who were crucified with Him reviled Him. These two men were pillagers of homes and men and women. They robbed, killed, raped, etc. They deserved the sentence which they were serving. Even on the Cross, they continued their evil ways by taunting Jesus along with the crowd saying "if you are the son of God, save yourself and us". But by the sixth hour, things were not the same with the one thief. In the gospel of Luke it says: But the other answering (the other thief) rebuked him, saying, do you not fear God, seeing that you are in the same condemnation? And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds: but this man has done nothing wrong. And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when Thou comest into Thy kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say to you, Today you will be with me in paradise.

We too have many opportunities to make the same confession.

First, we have our existence. Our first gift from God. Our existence and creation. He loved us into existence without us deserving it or having a hand in it. As long as we breathe air, we have an opportunity to call out to God.

Second, every moment we have to schedule Confession with the priest. We can and should do this all year round, several times a year. At least before the major holidays like Easter, Christmas, and the Dormition of the Virgin Mary, or when we have major need.

Third, Holy Week. During Holy Week, we have an opportunity to confess the Lord not only with our words but with our attentiveness. Some of us might believe if we lived during that time, surely we would have been by His side. Surely we would not scatter with the disciples. Surely we would not eat the fruit the serpent offered us.

Holy week is a mini model of our lives. If we do not stand with Him during these services, then how can we say we "would" stand with Him in the garden or at Golgotha?

It is the same every year. The multitudes were at Jerusalem after the raising of Lazarus proclaiming Jesus the King of Israel and singing Hosana just like hundreds and thousands attend on Palm Sunday. Many come for Holy Unction on Holy Wednesday and for the Epitaphio and Lamentations and Midnight on Holy Saturday to receive the Holy Light and sing Christ is Risen! Xristos Anesti! But very few stay with Him after Xristos Anesti. Very few are with Him as he is beaten and displayed as our Bridegroom on Holy Monday and Tuesday. This year there were 10 people in church on Holy Thursday at the 12 gospels when Jesus was hung on the Cross. Not one man was present to help and not one altar buy to hold a candle or help with Jesus.

But my brothers and sisters, do not be sorrowful for Jesus. It was He who prophesied to His disciples: 'I will strike the Shepherd, And the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' He said this when warning them that they would abandon Him. And another warning. He told those lamenting Him while carrying His Cross: "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for Me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For indeed the days are coming in which they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, wombs that never bore, and breasts which never nursed!'

Would we stand with Him? It is up to us to prove it.

Judas received His Body and Blood at the supper but did not experience the Resurrection.

Do we receive His Body and Blood? Have we stood with Him this Holy Week or any? Will we?

These are our opportunities to be transformed by Him. And He is never angry with us. He weeps and waits for us like He said on the Cross: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

It is our turn to live a life of repentance. How much do we love Him? What will we do now in our life? We have at least 52 Sundays in the year to prove it.

Will we confess "Lord, Remember me when You come into Your Kingdom"?

Will we Scatter when the shepard is stricken?

Will we shout Crucify Him with our apathy and lukewarmness? Or, will we join the few who stayed by His side? Peter who wept bitterly in repentance of his denial? Will we remain blind like the blind man? Will we remain paralyzed like the paralytic? I pray we embrace Him. Let us practice as the hymn says: let us say even to those who hate us, "Let us forgive everything for the Resurrection." And thus let us cry aloud, "Christ is risen from the dead, by death trampling down upon death, and to those in the tombs He has granted life."


